Points tabulated on placing: top six in the class will earn one point for themselves + one for each entry they beat. If placing in more than one class in a division, the placing with the highest points will be used. Ties to be broken using the In-Hand score.

Highest two-score average for one horse/rider combination. All dressage tests except Equitation to count, including walk/trot but not including Western Dressage. Ties to be broken by difficulty; highest test(s) of highest level(s) wins the tie. Award category determined by rider status: an Amateur may use Open and/or ATR classes, but will only be eligible for the Adult Amateur or Junior Rider award.

USEF FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, **Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition. I agree to be bound by the** Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

Entries. Fill out the official entry form and mail or hand-deliver to the show secretary along with full payment (check or money order payable to DONIDA FARM, US funds) and all documentation. No e-mailed, **phoned or faxed entries. Copies of the horse's registration papers and all membership cards must accompany entry.** Entries postmarked prior to opening date will incur a three-day penalty; entries postmarked after midnight on closing date will be accepted if space is available; post entry fees will be assessed.

Entries, Payment for. Mailed entries: enclose check or money order payable in US funds to DONIDA FARM. Postdated checks will not be accepted. Open checks are not allowed with the initial entry. If an open check is sent, it will be closed for the amount due at the time the entry is processed and will be deposited. An open check may be left in the show office during the show to cover post entries and other incidentals. Entries received without payment will be assessed an incomplete entry fee and will be subject to post entry penalties if payment is postmarked after close of entries. **You will be notified via a confirmation e-mail of any balance due, i.e., math errors, misunderstanding of fees, or failure to include post entry fees.** Amounts owed must be paid before numbers are released. By signing the entry form and/or submitting entries to us you agree to pay all fees due and understand refunds will not be made except for reasons listed in the published refund policy. If in doubt about fees or entry deadlines, phone before sending your entry. Submission of entry to us is your intent to show and acceptance of our show rules. All debts incurred at the show must be settled before removing a horse from the grounds.

Entries, Refusal/Removal of. Management reserves the right to hold classes conditionally, or cancel entries of any contestant, as stated in USEF Rules. The show committee reserves the right to remove any person and/or his horse from the show who has shown an objectionable attitude or behavior towards its management, or previous unsportsmanlike behavior, without being liable for compensation or damages. Refunds will not be given to exhibitors evicted for cause.

Entries, Wait listed. Every effort will be made to accommodate all who want to participate in the *Celebration Show*. Entries will be accepted in postmark order. Since there are a limited number of ride times in individually judged classes, those classes may **fill before the closing date. If that happens, entries for filled classes will be placed on a waiting list** and accepted by postmark order. Ties will be broken per USEF rules for entries on the waitlist with the same postmark by the show secretary the Wednesday after entries close.

Entry Confirmation will be sent via email to the legible email address on your entry form. Please review it as soon as it arrives to avoid unpleasant surprises when you arrive at the show office.

Entry Numbers Each horse shall be assigned an entry number which will be used throughout the weekend.

Refunds. Entries **cancelled prior to the show's closing date will be fully refunded except for the Office Fee.** Entries cancelled after closing date due to illness or injury require presentation of a doctor or veterinary statement (on official letterhead) for refund. The certificate must be received by the show secretary no later than noon of the day prior to the start of competition; such refund will fully refunded except for the Office Fee, which is non-refundable. No refunds will be made if notice of cancellation is received later than noon of the day prior to the start of competition. No refunds will be made if the entry is a no-show. Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that all or part of the competition is cancelled due to a storm, acts of God, illness, accident or other emergency at the show.

ATTENTION COMPETITORS

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct applicable numbers (AHA, USDF and USEF) for horse, owner, riders, handlers, and trainer, before the day(s) of the competition.

The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

Facility Information

Arena Dimensions & Footing. Walk/Trot Dressage and Western Dressage tests will be ridden in a 20x40m arena; all other tests, including all musical rides, will be ridden in a 20x60m arena.

- o 20x60m sand/rubber outdoor permanent dressage arena
- o **Two 225' x 250' outdoor "all-weather" sand/rubber arenas**
- o **100' X 200' indoor arena with Nike footing**
- o **70' X 150' indoor arena, footing is sand/rubber/Nike**

Camping. Permit required, \$30 per night per occupied unit (tent, trailer, RV). No hookups. Check facility map at the Welcome Barn to locate designated camping areas. Showers available for campers only, BYO towels and soap. Campgrounds must be **'horse-free', please.**

Dogs. If it is not possible to leave your dogs at home, please remember this is a private facility. Purchase a \$30 Dog Permit at the Welcome Barn or show office. Dogs must be tied or kenneled at campsite, in tack stall, or otherwise restrained all times; no off-leash anywhere on grounds. Permitted dogs must wear their fashion scarf (issued with permit). Dogs with scarves **allowed in the infield of the race track. Dogs are not welcome in the show office.** Dogs are not allowed in the vendor, concession, competition, warmup, and spectator areas. Person on the other end of the leash is responsible for picking up and **properly disposing of dog's deposits. \$50 fine and removal of competitor from show grounds with no refunds may result from infractions. All fee collection (registration or fine) is between the dog owner and Donida Farm. USEF rule GR1301.6: "Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash or otherwise contained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dogs' behaviors. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule may be subject to penalty under Chapters 6 and 7, as well as issuance of warning cards."**

Feed & hay will be available for purchase on site; limited selection, market price.

Food Vendor. Concessions on the grounds: breakfast, lunch, snacks, and beverages available for the entire show.

Footing. See Arenas above.

Lunging and under saddle schooling areas designated. Grass areas are not authorized for lunging or schooling. Map in show office and at Welcome Barn. Riding on racetrack only with permission from Donida Farm, and then only at walk, trot and collected canter.

Manure disposal: **Leave it cleaner than you found it!** Please pick (not strip) your stalls upon departing to keep our costs down for future events. Manure Wagons are provided at the end of each barn for your convenience. Donida wheelbarrows and forks have a way of disappearing, please plan accordingly. Pick up your garbage and place it in a garbage can or in a bag next to manure wagons. **"Take nothing but pictures. Leave nothing but hoofprints."**

Office hours. FRIDAY 4-7PM; thereafter from one hour before first class until 30 minutes after last class each day. Show Secretary: (360)687-2256, phone only, no texts.

Parking. Main barn/arena area for loading and unloading only. Trailer parking, spectator parking and camping areas designated; maps posted at Welcome Barn and Show Office **Keep fire lanes open at all times.**

Security. Exhibitors are advised that it is their responsibility to secure valuables and their stall areas. AHA, Donida Farm, their members, agents, employees and volunteers accept no responsibility for losses sustained or caused by any exhibitor.

Sharps containers for medical waste (needles, syringes, etc.) are mounted on or in each barn and stable block. A \$100 **fine per violation will be passed on to the violator for medical waste found in your area or if you are found disposing of materials improperly.**

Stabling. All stalls are 10x10 with full doors. Permanent stalls in Barns B-E; remaining stalls are 10x10 puckboard portables; **shedrow style, covered, with full doors, dirt floors, no mats. A limited number of lockable tack rooms are available.** Stalls will be pre-assigned and assignments posted at the show office and at the Welcome Barn at the facility entrance. All horses must be stalled, one horse per stall; no haul-ins, no shared stalls and no unweaned foals. Stalls may not be resold or sublet by exhibitors. Stalls are available from 1PM Wednesday through 6PM Sunday. Bring your own stall cleaning equipment, water buckets, and feed. Stalls include initial bedding. Additional pre-ordered bedding will be waiting in your assigned stall. Purchase additional bedding (baled shavings) at show office. Use of other bedding will incur \$35/day removal fee. No stall construction changes allowed. Riders will be charged damage fees; \$25 fee for nails in tack stalls.

No microwaves, refrigerators, hot plates, crock pots, or other electric appliances may be used in tack stalls or stabling area. Fans are permitted as long as cord is safely stowed off ground and away from horses. For horse and competitor safety, no extension cords crossing aisles. No pop-up tents or umbrellas or any other materials may block the aisles or driveways; aisles must be kept clear.

A Word about Horse Health

Veterinary Health Requirements. USEF Vaccination Rule (GR845). Competition Management reserves the right to review vaccination documentation. Non-compliant entries may be quarantined or denied permission to unload, and will not be allowed to compete nor to mingle with other horses. No refunds will be given if right to compete is denied because the Vaccination Record is missing or incomplete. Whether the horse is vaccinated by a veterinarian or by an owner or agent, or is exempt for medical or age reasons, documentation is required; see USEF GR845 for details. Download report form from USEF and bring completed, signed document(s) to the competition with the horse. Download the form from <https://www.usef.org/documents/membership/EquineVaccinationRecord.pdf>

Out-of-State Horses. Washington State **requires current (6 month) health certificate from state of origin, horse ID papers and Coggins test.** The regulations do change periodically. Washington State Department of Agriculture, (360) 902-1878, has the most recent information. Donida Farm is not **requiring health certificates or Coggins for this competition.**

IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF EXHIBITORS TO FAMILIARIZE THEMSELVES WITH THESE RULES. All exhibitors, by completing their entry, acknowledge and attest that they have read and understand all terms of these rules, wherever listed in this prize list.

Admission to the Competition, On-Deck and Schooling Areas. No person will be allowed in the competition ring except participants in the class, judges, and show photographer/videographer. There shall be no conduct in the on-deck area which disturbs or creates a hazard to horses, handlers, or spectators. No one is permitted on foot in the under saddle warm-up and schooling arenas.

Age of Horse. For competition purposes, a horse is considered to be one year old on the first day of January following the foaling date. A junior horse is one that is five years of age or younger. A horse must be at least 36 months of age (from actual foaling date) to compete under saddle in the Dressage section.

Announcements. Official updates to this prize list, ride times and other announcements will be posted at www.DonidaFarm.com. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to secure the most current version of posted show information. Starting the day prior to competition, announcements will be posted at the show office.

Awards Ribbons through 6 places, to 8 in Equitation. Prize to First place in all classes with three or more entries. Rail classes (Sport Horse Under Saddle, Show Hack.) will be pinned in the ring. Please bring your blue ribbon to the Awards Tent to claim your award. Individual classes (Dressage, Western Dressage, In-Hand). When the class is complete, results will be posted at the Awards Tent, where you may claim your scoresheets, ribbons & awards. If you leave early, please make arrangements for someone to pick up your scoresheets, ribbons and awards from the Awards Tent. Celebration championships will not show back; Horses are awarded on scores. (AR 173.3).

Change of Handler/Rider. **Please fill out a handler/rider change form, including signatures, correct association numbers and required documentation, in the show office prior to the start of the class.** This will ensure that points are recorded correctly for qualifying purposes.

Changes to Schedule or Venue. Management reserves the right to make changes of arenas, judges or class order to facilitate time schedule and conditions. All changes will be posted on the announcement board at the office and the appropriate announcements made during the competition. Classes with no entries by closing date may be cancelled. Competition management reserves the right to cancel, combine or split classes at its discretion. Show management reserves the right to add or substitute judges as required. Upon receipt of the preliminary ride schedule, it is the rider's responsibility to notify Show Management if they are NOT eligible to show for a substitute or added judge.

Class Calls. It is the exhibitors' responsibility to follow how quickly classes are progressing and to promptly present themselves when the gate person calls for their class. The public address system is a courtesy to the exhibitors and its function cannot be guaranteed. No refunds will be made solely because of sound system inadequacy or failure.

Coach is defined as an adult who receives remuneration for having or sharing the responsibility for instructing, teaching, schooling, or advising a rider, driver, handler or vaulter in equestrian skills. That person must sign the entry and provide proof of USEF membership if coaching on the show grounds.

Combination of Classes: The Show Management reserves the right to cancel, combine or divide classes, or change order for award purposes where less than three (3) horses entered. Classes listed are a tentative schedule and may be changed at the discretion of the Show Management. Competitors will be notified of any class changes from this tentative schedule in accordance with GR830. Class size may also be limited by Show Management. Classes cancelled because of weather may be rescheduled or remain cancelled.

Delay of Class / "Gate Hold". *In classes where horses compete collectively, when it is found that a gate hold must be requested by an exhibitor such request shall be made to the Paddock Manager (gate person) prior to the close of judging of the class immediately before the class requiring the gate hold. The reason for the request must be stated. The gate hold will be a maximum of three (3) minutes. Gate holds are only allowed for group classes; "...in classes where horses compete individually, failure to check in with the Paddock Manager or to enter the competition arena at the assigned time will result in elimination."* [GR831.1]

When horses are competing collectively, if a first horse does not enter the in-gate ready to participate within one minute from when the class is called into the ring, a warning is issued.

- a. Exhibitors will then have one additional minute to start the steady stream of horses into the in-gate.
- b. If no horses have entered the gate at the conclusion of the additional one minute, the gate shall be closed and the class is deemed concluded.
- c. Once the first horse has entered the in-gate, a steady stream of horses must be maintained.
- d. Should the steady stream be broken after the two minutes have elapsed, the gate shall be closed and judging will commence.
- e. A steady stream is defined as a constant flow of horses moving forward through the in-gate with a reasonable and safe distance between them (i.e. two to four horse or horse and buggy lengths in between)
- f. Show Management in conjunction with the Steward may deviate from this procedure as circumstances warrant.

General Information, please read it

Disputes not covered by the rules. This horse show is conducted in accordance with the rules of the US Equestrian Federation and the Arabian Horse Association. Should any question or dispute arise not provided for in the governing rules of USEF and AHA, it shall be referred to the Show Manager for resolution-

Drug and Medication Rule. Refer to USEF Chapter 4. Medication Report Forms are available from the Show Steward and may be **filed online**.

Judging System. **Single judge system; judge's decision in all classes final.**

Junior Exhibitor. An individual who has not reached his or her 19th birthday as of December 1st of the previous calendar year is a Junior **Exhibitor ("Junior")** in the Arabian Division. All Junior Exhibitors are considered Amateurs for competition purposes. [AR110.6]

Management Rights. Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of any incident in the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulation shall **be decided by Show Management and the Show Management's decision shall be final. Show Management reserves the right to refuse** entries for cause, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries and cancel awards without claim to damages; to change, cancel or combine classes, to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors, or to change rings or rotate judges. Management may deny entry to any competitor if the competitor has outstanding debt to the sponsoring organization. See USEF rule GR914 Refusal of Entries and GR915 Limiting Entries

Motorized Vehicles in accordance with GR1301.7: **Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a** motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with **a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian** of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the **competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed** against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Protests. **Protests may be filed as set forth in USEF GR603.**

Returned Checks / Denied Credit Cards A check returned or credit card denied by the bank for any reason will incur a \$50 fee per occurrence. **No checks will be processed a second time. To retain entries, fees plus penalty must be paid by money order, cashier's check or cash within 7 days of notification. Entries received without valid payment will not be processed until full payment is received** and will be subject to post entry penalties if payment is postmarked after close of entries. Show packets will not be released until all debts are settled. In the event a check is returned by the bank after the completion of the show, it will be handled in accordance with USEF GR913.

Scoring Errors. If a mathematical scoring error on the score sheet is discovered, it must be reported to Show Secretary within one hour of the official posting of the scores from the last scored class of that competition day the error will stand with no change in class placings.

Scratched Classes. **After the close of entries, canceling a horse's entry in one or more classes is a 'scratch'. No fees will be refunded.** Please scratch horses with the Show Secretary prior to the class to avoid penalty. **If you don't show up for an assigned ride time, this** Competition reserves the right to scratch you from all remaining dressage rides and offer them to other exhibitors. If you are unable or choose not to ride, notify the secretary immediately.

Trainer. **USEF defines Trainer as "the adult is responsible for the horse (care and custody) while it is on the show grounds." The parent or guardian of a minor exhibitor must assume the responsibilities of "Trainer." Therefore, every horse does have a Trainer,** and that person must sign the entry and provide copies of membership cards or pay associated fees. Parents signing as Trainer for minor children are exempt from association fees. *If you keep your horse at home (or board out) and pay for riding lessons, but do not pay for full time training and care, the person you pay for lessons is your "Coach".*

Unrelated Owners in "Owner" Classes – Now in effect as of Dec. 1, 2018. For the purposes of showing in Junior Owner and Amateur Owner classes, two non-related owners will now be able to co-own a horse and show in owner classes provided the following rules are followed. The ownership **MUST** be an AND relationship and not an OR relationship. No family member of a professional may **enter into this relationship. "Non- family owners" are defined as two distinct individuals who are not related as family as defined by US** Equestrian or Equestrian Canada. The horse must be registered with one of the five Registries in US or Canada or another approved Registry. Family members of these two co-owners are **NOT** permitted to show in owner classes. Both co-owners must be members of USEF or EC and hold valid amateur cards. Co-ownership is limited to two distinct individuals (no farms or business entities). A horse can only be in (1) one non-related Co-ownership per show season – if a co-ownership is terminated, another co-ownership cannot be entered into for that horse until the next year. An individual can only enter into (2) two distinct non-related co-ownerships at any one time. Show management may deny horses in this relationship entry into AO/JO classes with payout in excess of \$2,500. Please see USEF AR110.4.e. for complete requirements and limitations.

Unsportsmanlike Conduct will not be tolerated and management reserves the right to bar any person acting in a manner deemed improper, unethical, dishonest, unsportsmanlike or intemperate, or prejudicial to the best interests of the sport. USEF GR702 will apply. **Note GR 702.1.e: [Violations of this rule include] "Any act committed or remark made in connection with the competition considered offensive and/or made with the intent to influence or cast aspersions on the character or integrity of the licensed officials, approaching a judge before or after a decision without first obtaining permission from the show committee or steward/technical delegate, inspecting a judge's card without the judge's permission, or public verbal abuse of competition officials."**

Membership

THIS IS A USEF "LOCAL" MEMBER SHOW. USEF MEMBERSHIP IS NOT REQUIRED TO PARTICIPATE.



USEF Membership requirements for participation in Amateur Restricted classes Active Equine Canada members who are not current USEF members and want to compete in an amateur class are not required to pay for a USEF membership or Show Pass fee; however, they must fill out the USEF membership application with their name, signature, date of birth and check the "Amateur" box in order to be eligible to compete in an amateur restricted class.

ANYONE ELSE COMPETING IN AN AMATEUR CLASS WILL BE REQUIRED TO SHOW PROOF OF AMATEUR STATUS ISSUED BY USEF. Only active Federation members [Competition memberships] may obtain amateur status. Every person who has reached his/her 19th birthday and competes in classes for amateurs under Federation Arabian rules must possess current amateur status issued by the Federation. **Exceptions**• Any person who has not reached his/her 19th birthday as of December 1 of the previous calendar year is a Junior Exhibitor; all Junior Exhibitors are considered amateurs for competition purposes. Proof of amateur status is not required for Opportunity classes. (GR1307.1 and AR 110.6)

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR218) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes. Updated 02/01/2020

AHA MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT. Each competitor (this includes at least one recorded owner and all trainers, drivers, riders, halter handlers, coaches and the person(s) signing the entry blank) in an Arabian Horse Association recognized Arabian division, at the time of entry into a competition, must submit a copy of a valid AHA Membership/Competition card, join AHA or pay an AHA Single Event Membership Fee per competitor. When an Agent signs for the Owner at an AHA recognized competition, both the Owner and Agent must be members of AHA or pay the AHA Single Event Membership. Single Event Membership is not acceptable at AHA Regional or National Competitions. Exhibitors in walk-trot classes are exempt from AHA membership requirements at qualifying competitions but must have an AHA membership with Competition Card at AHA Regional and National Competitions. Exhibitors in leadline classes or parents/ guardians signing for minors are exempt from AHA membership requirements. (BOD 5/12)



AHA Competition Card Requirements. Current COMPETITION CARDS for all concerned must be mailed with entry or entry will be considered incomplete. All riders, drivers, owners, agents and handlers who exhibit horses in the show ring or sign the entry form as the responsible party for any individual's horses at the show must show proof of AHA COMPETITION level membership or pay a Single Event Membership fee of \$35 per person. If the recorded owner is an entity (Farm, Ranch, Syndicate, etc.) and does not have a current AHA Business membership, a Single Event Membership must be purchased for that entity.

Exhibitors in Walk/Trot Celebration classes and Parents/Guardians signing for minors are exempt from AHA membership (refer to AHA Article 705).

Membership

USDF Membership Benefits: USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the *USDF Member Guide* or the USDF website at www.usdf.org.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)



Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form and fax or mail it to the USDF office.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

Regarding Freestyle Rides

Effective December 1, 2019 - DR129.9: Except for USEF/USDF Championship classes and for FEI Pony Riders, FEI Junior, FEI Young Rider and FEI Para-Equestrian Freestyles, in order to enter a freestyle class at any level, a horse/rider combination must have received a minimum score of 63% for Training through Fourth levels and 60% for FEI levels in the highest test of the declared freestyle level or any test of a higher level at a USEF/USDF licensed Dressage Competition, Federation Licensed or FEI **recognized Dressage Competition, or "open" Dressage class** (i.e. open to all breeds) at a Federation Licensed Competition held prior to the competition where the horse/rider combination is entered to ride a freestyle class. A photocopy of the test verifying eligibility, or copy of the USDF score verification, must be submitted with the entry for a freestyle class.

Please note: A 60% or higher earned by a horse/rider combination at the FEI levels may be applied for a Freestyle ridden at a lower level. For sake of example, a 60% or higher earned by a horse/rider combination at the FEI Prix St. Georges level will allow a rider/horse combination to compete in a Fourth level freestyle (or any lower level freestyle). Additionally, as a reminder, a 60% or higher earned in the FEI Grand Prix 16-25 test will also qualify a rider/horse combination to ride the FEI Grand Prix Freestyle. A 60% or higher earned in the Intermediate A or Intermediate B test will qualify a rider/horse combination to ride the Intermediate A/B Freestyle (Medium Tour).

Responsibility

Release of Responsibility. Donida Farm, Don Morin, Gwen and/or David Blake, USEF, USDF, AHA, the Show Management, Show Officials, Show Facilities, their Directors and/or employees and volunteers will not be responsible for any accident and/or loss that may occur to any exhibitor, competitor, agent, horse, and/or Equipment. Washington State Equine Limitation of Liability Act RCW 4.24 applies. **Horses, by their inherent nature present a risk of injury, harm or death. Riders represent that they are qualified to participate** at the level entered. Each exhibitor is responsible for any injury or harm that may be occasioned to any person, whomsoever, by any horse owned or exhibited by said exhibitor, and shall hold harmless and indemnify any agencies or persons listed above, against all claims or demands, of any nature or kind, that may grow out of any injury occasioned by any horses owned or exhibited by them, or arise from the negligence of the person in charge of such horse. All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents of their horses. All horses exhibited at these shows participate **entirely at the owner's or rider's risk. All owners and exhibitors will be held responsible for any damage** caused by them, their agents, their horses, or their employees to stalls, buildings, and other properties on the show grounds and shall be billed accordingly. No horse is allowed on the grounds unless it has been entered in the show and the owner has signed the release waiver on the entry form.

Release of Responsibility, Additional. By signing the entry agreement, I further agree to: release, indemnify and hold harmless USDF, its instructors, officers, directors, agents, and volunteers from and against any and all loss, liability or damage arising from or because of, or in connection with, participation in this competition or related activities. I also hereby agree to release, indemnify and hold harmless the show management, show committee and members, officers, directors, agents, and volunteers from and against any and all loss, liability or damage arising from or because of, or in connection with, participation in this competition or related activities.

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States with a membership of nearly 30,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the **horse's** natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the **horse's** athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the **horse's** life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the **horse's** welfare in pursuit of dressage training.
